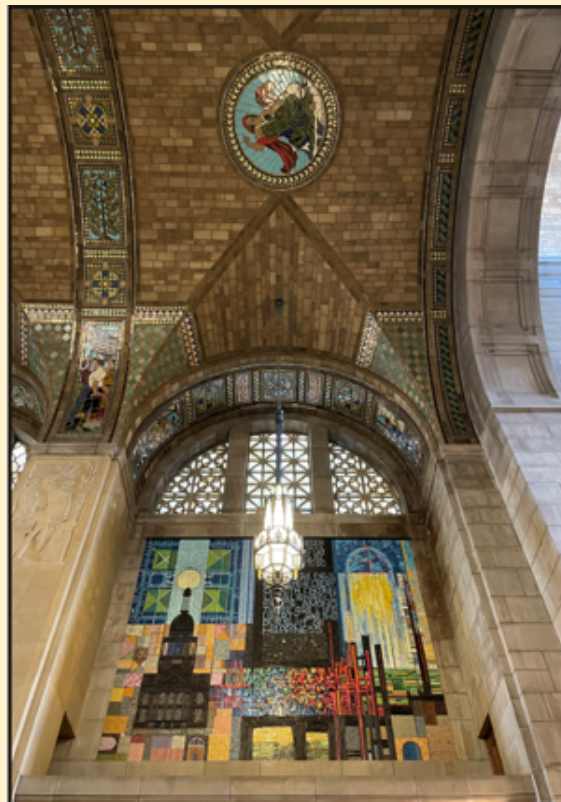

In addition, we have subscriptions to two online research databases, JSTOR (focused on the social sciences) and EBSCO (focused on health and medicine) which provide digital access to a wide range of academic journals and other materials. PERIODICALS BY TITLE

American Affairs

Each issue explores topics in domestic and foreign policy, as well as broader debates in economic theory, political thought, and social criticism. (Quarterly)

The Atlantic

Features groundbreaking articles on politics, social trends, education, literature, and the arts. (10 issues per year)

Aviation Week & Space Technology

The world's leading aviation and aerospace publication, delivers cutting edge developments in technology, business and operations in the civil, military and space sectors. (Biweekly)

Bloomberg Businessweek

This business and finance magazine provides new and ongoing commentary about current business environments in the United States and around the globe. Previously known as **BusinessWeek**, the magazine debuted in New York City in 1929. (Weekly)

Child Welfare Journal

This scholarly, peer-reviewed journal links the latest findings in child welfare and related research with information on best practices, program development, and timely public policy debates. (Bimonthly)

Chronicle of Higher Education

A leading resource for in-depth information on U.S. colleges and universities. Reports on a broad range of academic topics including government affairs, international news, scholarships, and athletes. (48 issues per year)

City Journal

One of the nation's premier urban policy magazines, it offers a mix of articles on topics ranging from school finance, policing strategies, and welfare policy to urban architecture and family policy. It also highlights the latest in urban policy theory. (Quarterly)

Correctional Law Reporter

Summarizes the key legal decisions in corrections in a non-technical way. Issues covered include: supervised release, probation, and parole. (Bimonthly)

Corrections Managers' Report

Written by corrections professionals, the publication offers practical guidance on how to effectively manage corrections facilities, finances, staff, and inmate populations. (Bimonthly)

Creighton Law Review

Emphasizes legal issues impacting Nebraska and the Eight Circuit. It includes legal articles, commentary, and case notes. (Quarterly)

Criminology

Focuses on examining crime and deviant behavior. As an interdisciplinary field, the journal features articles that contribute to the theoretical and research development of criminology and criminal justice. (Quarterly)

Criminology and Public Policy

Examines criminal justice policy and practice. The journal's primary goal is to enhance the use of research in shaping criminal justice policies by publishing empirically driven, policy-oriented articles. (Quarterly)

The Economist

Provides insight and opinion on international news, politics, business, finance, science, and technology. (Biweekly)

Education Week

Offers articles, analysis, and opinion on key K-12 education issues such as education reform, accountability, assessment, and finance. (40 issues per year)

Farm Journal

This publication emphasizes agricultural production, technology, and policy and is the largest national U.S. farm magazine. (Monthly)

Forbes

Features original articles on finance, industry, investing, and marketing topics and the law. Founded in 1917, **Forbes** magazine was the only major business magazine in the U.S. through the 1920s.

Government Finance Review

Publishes articles on a broad range of thought and practice in state and local government, finance, and financial management. Explores best practices in government finance. (Bimonthly)

Government Technology

Covers information technology's role in state and local government. Offers in-depth coverage of IT case studies, emerging technologies, and the implications of digital technology on the politics and management of public sector organizations. (Monthly)

Harvard Business Review

Highlights research and case studies focused on leadership, organizational change, negotiation strategy, operations, marketing, finance, regulatory policy, and personnel management. (Bimonthly)

Hastings Center Report

Explores current ethical, legal, and social issues in medicine, health care, public health, and the life sciences. (Bimonthly)

Health Affairs

Examines current health policy issues of concern in both the U.S. and international spheres. Its mission is to serve as a high-level, nonpartisan forum to promote analysis and discussion on improving health and health care. (Monthly)

Issues in Science and Technology

Published by the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, the journal is a forum for discussion of public policy related to science, engineering, and medicine. (Quarterly)

Journal of Education Finance

Recognized as one of the leading journals in the field of funding public schools, each issue brings original research and analysis on topics such as educational reform, adequacy and equality of public-school funding, and taxation. (Quarterly)

Journal of State Taxation

Provides guidance, information and creative tax planning strategies for tackling problems involving state taxes. Presents comprehensive multistate information in both feature articles and multistate charts and tables. Digital (weekly)

Lincoln Journal Star

Daily newspaper covering the Lincoln metropolitan area and the state of Nebraska. Also includes national and international news. (Daily) Noncirculating.

Midlands Business Journal

Spotlights businesses in the greater Omaha, Lincoln, and Council Bluffs areas. (Weekly)

National Affairs

Publishes thought-provoking essays dealing with domestic policy issues ranging from economics and health care to education and welfare. It also covers legal debates of the day and enduring dilemmas of society and culture. (Quarterly)

National Review

Editorial magazine focusing on news and commentary on political, social, and cultural affairs. (Biweekly)

National Tax Journal

The journal publishes peer reviewed articles that include economic, theoretical, and empirical analyses of tax and expenditure issues with an emphasis on policy implications. (Quarterly)

Nebraska Farmer

Offers timely information relating to agronomy, livestock, economics, management of production agriculture, and state and national legislation. (Monthly)

Nebraska History

Explores Nebraska's history and culture through original articles and historical images. Features biographies, stories on political, economic, social, and ethnic issues as well as institutional and architectural history. (Quarterly)

Nebraska Law Review

Publishes articles focused primarily on law in Nebraska and the Eighth Circuit, but also includes pieces on national and international law. (Quarterly)

Nebraska Life

Highlights Nebraska's culture, heritage, and natural surroundings. (Bimonthly)

Nebraska Municipal Review

Features articles on laws and issues affecting local government. Of interest to both municipal leaders and anyone with an interest in local government. (Monthly)

Nebraskaland Magazine

Spotlights hunting and fishing in Nebraska along with conservation, pioneer history, and in-state travel through articles and outstanding color photography. (Monthly)

New Republic

Features commentary on American politics, foreign policy, and the arts. (48 issues per year)

New Yorker

Features commentary on American politics, foreign policy, and the arts. (Weekly)

Omaha World Herald

Daily newspaper covering the Omaha-Council Bluffs metropolitan area and outstate Nebraska. Also includes national and international news features. (Daily) Noncirculating.

Pensions & Investments

Focuses on corporate and institutional investing. Features topics such as cash management, corporate finance, middle markets, and real estate. (Biweekly)

Public Power

Directed toward officials of locally owned electric systems, the publication highlights innovative energy technologies and American Public Power Association activities. (Bimonthly)

Rural Electric Nebraskan

Geared toward rural Nebraskans, it features general interest articles such as how to reduce electricity bills. (Monthly)

Science News

Delivers short articles about new scientific and technical developments, typically gleaned from recent scientific and technical journals. Science News has been published since 1922 by the Society for Science and the Public (Biweekly)

Smithsonian

The official journal of the Smithsonian Institution, it provides an in-depth analysis of varied topics including science, history, art, popular culture and innovation. (Monthly)

Stateline Midwest

Keeps members of the Midwestern Legislative Conference up to date on policy issues impacting their states, actions being taken by the region's 11 state legislatures, and work being done by the Midwestern Legislative Conference and the Council of State Governments. (11 issues per year)

The Week

Brings together the most relevant and important news from over 200 media sources around the globe. In addition to original content, it presents concise summaries of news stories and opinion columns published by other media outlets earlier in the week including from non-English media. (Weekly)

Time

Covers a range of national and international news, politics, arts, and culture. (Weekly)

Wall Street Journal

Daily newspaper covering the world of business along with national and international news. Also publishes a supplemental magazine featuring luxury lifestyle trends. (Daily) Noncirculating.

Water Current

Details current activities of the UNL Water Center and developments in the water industry in Nebraska. (Quarterly)
